Up-to-date, relevant, and broad experience of working in the occupational area of the apprenticeship standard including practical and current knowledge of working practices which reflect the whole standard content.	
Have sufficient, verifiable, relevant current industry experience, knowledge and understanding of the occupational working area at, or above, the level being assessed.	
Have sufficient occupational expertise so they have up to date experience, knowledge and understanding of the particular aspects of work they are assessing. This could be verified by continuing professional achievements.	
Have a sound, in depth knowledge of, and uphold the integrity of, the sector's NOS and the assessment strategy	
Possession of a relevant NVQ/SVQ level 3 or vocationally related qualification	
Must be able to evidence relevant and up to date CPD, which is related directly to the standard and industry, not just general CPD	
Occupationally competent with current experience in the apprenticeship's discipline they intend to assess	
Possession of a relevant NVQ/SVQ level 3 or vocationally related qualification	
Hold, or are working towards, a qualification as listed within 'Assessing and Assuring Quality of Assessment', either in the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF), or the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF):  For e.g., qualifications include A1, D32/33.	
Holders of A1 and D32/33 must assess to the reviewed National Occupational
