Essential	Desirable
Up-to-date, relevant, and broad experience of working in adult care, including current knowledge of working practices, legislation, and policy within the sector. Examples of areas worked in may include:	Experience of preparing for and presenting to a target audience
Be able to demonstrate experience of being a lead practitioner within the care team, contributing to, promoting and sustaining a values-based culture at an operational level.	
Demonstrate examples of coaching and mentoring others in their roles.	Experience of marking and grading assessments
Example of work may include residential care, nursing home, domiciliary care, day centres, service users' own home, or some clinical health care settings.	
 Have at least three years' work experience in the sector. This means they can carry out the full requirements within the competence they are assessing: possessing knowledge, understanding experience relevant to the Apprenticeship Standard being assessed. 	
This should be maintained annually through clearly demonstrable continuing learning and professional development.	
Qualified to at least the level of care they are assessing.	
Hold a formal assessor qualification at, or equivalent to, RQF level 3.	
Hold a formal internal quality assurance qualification at, or equivalent to, RQF level 4. (For LIEPA role)
